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CHAPTER 1: Portrait of Heep Yunn School

School Background

By the Grace of God, Heep Yunn School is an Anglican school established in 1936, when two former Church Missionary Society institutions, namely Fairlea School (1886) and Victoria Home and Orphanage (1887), were joined together. The name “Heep Yunn” means “united in grace” in Chinese. Over the years, Heep Yunn has gradually grown from a Vernacular school into an English-medium school providing a high quality, all-round education for girls in Hong Kong. In 2012, the school switched its status from a government grant-in-aid school to a direct subsidy scheme school.

The founders of Heep Yunn were committed to bringing education to young women and orphans in answer to the call of duty at a time of economic instability and threat of war in 1930’s Hong Kong. They believed in empowering students to bring enlightenment to our nation and support to our people. To this day, the school abides by its dedication to serve our fellow men in the love of Christ.

School Vision and Mission

It is the mission of the school to provide our students with a Christian education that develops the whole person in the following areas: moral, intellectual, physical, social, aesthetic and spiritual; to instil in our girls a spirit of public service, and to build a firm foundation in both Chinese and English.

Campus and Facilities

Our school is located on an 11,000 sq. m. campus consisting of six building blocks, each with its unique history and purposes. These include the Lau Cheung Suet Ming Building (1936), the Chapel of St. Clare of Assisi (1957), the Chau Hau Leung & Li Shiu Ching Building (1964), the Library (1966), the Jubilee Building (1986) and the Mr. & Mrs. Au Sue Hung Building (2005). Additionally, our outdoor facilities include a 25-metres swimming pool, 4 multi-purpose games courts, a rest garden, a parking area and a lawn. Indoors, we have the School Hall, Dining Room, Student Activity Centre, Student Development Centre, 30 special rooms including the Drama Laboratory, the Innovation Laboratory, and the Lecture Theatre, 30 classrooms, and a 3-storey high sports centre.

CHAPTER 2: School Development- Review on the Annual Major Concerns

3-Year Development Goal (1)

To facilitate students' learning through enhancing teachers' assessment literacy.

Annual Major Concern (1)

To advance students' learning and teaching effectiveness by enhancing the classroom assessments.

Progress and Achievements

Stepping into the second year of collaboration with the Quality School Improvement Project (QSIP) under the Hong Kong Institute of Educational Research (HKIER) of the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), the School had moved from analysing summative assessment to bolstering classroom assessments in the academic year 2023-24. As was last year, a three-tiered staff development programme was devised to achieve the goal:

The first tier involved all teaching staff in a structured professional development programme arranged by the Staff Development Committee. It began with a kicking-off briefing, complemented by a self-learning resource pack on the art of questioning, followed by a structured peer lesson observation exercise with the focus on questioning technique. Deep reflection and genuine feedbacks from teachers indicated that the team embraced growth mindset to learn from each other. As opined by participants, "the lesson observation yielded success and learning opportunities, which will inform and enrich his/her future practices.". For instance, teachers were reminded the importance to gauge students' understanding and learning progress, thereby providing apt scaffolding, and build on students' prior knowledge or zone of proximal development to promote higher-order thinking.

The second tier concerned the middle-managers, a special workshop was held in January by the QSIP Team on the topic "Lesson observation and post-lesson debriefing skills of subject panel heads". The significance of panel heads as the gatekeeper to exercise instructional leadership was highlighted. All Heads of Departments agreed unanimously that the theme of the workshop addressed his/her needs and concerns over his/her work, and the workshop provided concrete and practical suggestions to aid their work.

Selected seed groups including the Personal, Social and Humanities Education (PSHE) Key Learning Area (KLA) and the Science and Technology and Junior Science Departments were involved in the third tier. Focused meetings and shadowing were arranged by the QSIP team. The strategies to promote cross-curricular project and to develop school-based curriculum were discussed. To consolidate their experiences, promote the sharing of best practices and enhance professional communication, the pioneer groups shared their insights gained in an end-of-term experience-sharing session in August, guided by the QSIP, for all teaching staff. The presentations were delivered with clarity and openness, focusing not only on the success but also reflections on their limitations and possible way-outs. Survey revealed that 98.7% of respondents agreed that the sharing by selected departments improved their understanding of the related topic; 97.4% of participants agreed that the strategies and practices introduced by their colleague(s) were stimulating and thought-provoking; 97.4% of them thought that the sharing by their colleague(s) could facilitate professional development on subject-departmental/ school level. Overall, the primary goal of building teachers' capacity for the effective use of assessment data with the focus on enhancing classroom assessments was by and large achieved.

Reflection

Leveraging support from the Quality School Improvement Project (QSIP) of the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK), our dedicated team of teachers advanced from mastering summative assessment data to enriching classroom assessment practices this year. Through a renewed, structured and focused peer lesson observation initiative, our teachers capitalised from each other's unique strength, co-creating a collaborative learning environment.

However, some participants expressed the view that while the intensive professional development programme was meaningful, it required a substantial time commitment. Given the demanding schedules of teachers, they found it challenging to engage in more authentic interactions with students and to provide tailored support to each individual, particularly when they had spent more time to pen the reflection gained.

Future Planning

The above strategies are in alignment with the promotion of the “seven learning goals of secondary education” advocated by the Education Bureau, in particular with the pursuit of “breath of knowledge”, “language proficiency” and “generic skills”. Instead of exploring assessment literacy in the co-curricular programmes as originally stated in the school development plan, the School has fine-tuned the major concern to “promoting quality formative assessment and adopt diversified assessment modes across various subjects” for the third year. This change was intended to keep the good momentum in the academic departments in advancing different forms of assessment. Having delved into summative assessment and classroom

assessment in the first two years, the School will stride forward to explore further on formative assessment in the third year

Gaining insights from the QSIP teams for two years, our team of dedicated staff were well acquainted with the trend of assessment literacy and were able to originate plans for quality formative assessment. Therefore, to optimise resources and time, partnership with external tertiary institutions will be scaled down in the third year. Alternatively, Academic Committee together with the Professional Development Committee will take a more leading role in arranging professional development activities regarding quality formative assessment.

3-Year Development Goal (2):

To cultivate positive values among students and nurture them into becoming responsible citizens with the commitment to serve.

Annual Major Concern (2):

To promote students' understanding of our community and our country's development and nurture them into becoming responsible citizens.

Progress and Achievements

Heep Yunn is committed in building lasting characters and mindsets among students. Cultivating proper values among students through both regular lessons and outside classrooms has consistently been a priority for the School.

In 2023-24, value education maintained its vigor across all departments, with a sharper focus on national education. A whole school approach was adopted to the launching of school-based national education framework, in which all subjects infused elements of national education or national security education in the curriculum. This was further amplified in the national education fortnight spanning late February and early March. The following are some selected inter-department measures adopted: Form Two students were guided to create flour figurines during their Visual Arts lessons, drawing from a character they learnt in the school-based Chinese curriculum. In Form Three, a series of "Chinese Literary Walks", jointly organised by the Chinese Department and the Chinese History Department, took place in Tokwawan. Through comprehensive reading and guided writing, teachers led students outside the classroom to experience community culture and learn about our heritage and history. This enhanced their understanding of social and national development, fostering a sense of belonging to our country. Survey results indicated that 95.6% of students felt their understanding of the community's history and development had deepened, while nearly 90% expressed greater concern for their community. They also reported a willingness to contribute to community development and environmental conservation. As for Form Four, students explored

excerpts from the Cantonese opera (《帝女花·香夭》) in their Chinese class, gaining insights into its unique features, while in music class, they studied the singing styles and performance forms of Cantonese music. Subsequently, all Form Four students, alongside non-Chinese speaking students from Forms One and Two and over ten teachers, visited the Tea House Theatre at the Xiqu Centre in West Kowloon, experiencing the art of Chinese opera firsthand.

Other departments also promoted national education through various projects and life-wide learning activities. For example, a cross-curricular project was launched in Form Three within the Personal, Social, and Humanities Education (PSHE) Key Learning Areas, focusing on the country's role in promoting sustainable development through the United Nations. Additionally, the Citizenship and Social Development (CSD) Department organised a two-night, one-day camp in Kuk Po, where students learned about Hakka village life, heritage, and ecological conservation.

With the aims to nurture students into becoming responsible citizens, themed class periods were arranged by the Moral and Civic Education Team with the support of class teachers. The focus was tailored for each form, with Form One on “Respect for others/ Benevolence”; Form Two on “Empathy”; Form Three on “Commitment”; Form Four on “Perseverance” and Form Five on “Integrity” respectively. Regular assemblies on national development and Chinese culture were also conducted. Over 70% of students agreed that the class periods reinforced positive values fundamental to responsible citizenship.

Tapping the advantage of the Quality Education Fund- Enhanced My Pledge to Act Programme, our School also collaborated with Ming Pao to offer an array of seminars, visits and workshops, with the aims to strengthen students, parents and teachers’ national identity, as well as to enhance the media literacy among them. For instance, a whole-school seminar on “National Achievement on Poverty Eradication” led by a former frontline reporter resulted in 77.4% of students stating that their understanding of national poverty alleviation policies had deepened, and 73.8% affirmed that their understanding of national security had improved and their national identity was strengthened. Additionally, 77.4% expressed increased interest in national development, and 77.1% felt pride in the country’s achievements regarding poverty eradication.

Students were also provided authentic encounter with the mainland through the refined Personal Growth Programme. In 2023-24, all Form Three students participated in a service tour to Guizhou, with 98.1% agreeing that the primary school visit and voluntary teaching sessions provided valuable insights into educational settings in the mainland. Furthermore, 98.2% affirmed that visits to villages and interactions with peasants enhanced their understanding of agricultural development in our country, while 98.1% expressed satisfaction with the bonfire party and ethnic performances, leading

to a greater appreciation of the customs and culture of ethnic minorities. Students also enjoyed museum visits and show appreciation to the scenic beauty of Guizhou.

Similarly, the CSD Department arranged mainland study tours for Forms Four and Five, following “Route 4” as specified by the Education Bureau. These tours included visits to the Opium War Museum, the Guangdong Memorial Hall of East River Column, and the Guangdong Museum of Revolutionary History in July and August, deepening students’ understanding of the country's history and the significance of national security. In addition to compulsory tours, voluntary tours were organised, including a four-day study visit to Shanghai and Nanjing from 12th to 16th July, 2024, where students explored important historical sites, including the Site of the First National Congress of the Chinese Communist Party, Sun Yat-sen's Mausoleum, furthering their understanding of the country’s history.

Other exchange programmes with the mainland including sports training and competition and music interflows were also in place. For example, our Basketball Team was selected to represent Hong Kong in several national and cross-border competitions. The team achieved an impressive 5th place out of 18 teams in the rigorous Nike All China High School Basketball Competition 2024 (Western District) held in Chengdu, Sichuan. Our Senior Choir also participated in the 17th China International Chorus Festival and performed in the Opening Concert of the festival at Concert Hall of the National Centre for the Performing Arts.

With the concerted efforts, the “Assessment Program for Affective and Social Outcomes (3rd Version) (APASO III)” results indicated consistently high Q-scores for “national identity” across all subscales, including “responsibility, obligation”, “pride, love”, “national flag, anthem”, and “achievements”, with scores reaching as high as 116. This outcome reaffirmed the effectiveness of the School’s measures in promoting national identity and related values, which were in alignment with the priority values, including “responsibility” and “commitment” of the Education Bureau.

Reflection

Our country has a rich legacy of culture and history, understanding its development is undeniably a lifelong task for all. Though there are still much we could learn about and from our country, we are delighted to have opened the door to this journey of understanding for our students. Through a whole-school approach to national education, we are pleased to observe that our efforts to nurture responsible citizenship among students are beginning to yield positive results. Meaningful collaboration between departments has effectively promoted national education, linking regular lessons with authentic experiences beyond the classroom, thereby providing students with optimal opportunities to explore the beauty of Chinese culture.

The school's pledge is to help our girls to develop, alongside academic excellence, a compassion for others, integrity and truthfulness, social responsibility and a commitment to care for and to serve others, in order that they will be ready for their responsibilities as future leaders of the community. Beyond the quantitative measures on national identity, we hope that our students' interactions with their counterparts in the mainland will ignite a passion for gaining a deeper understanding of our fellow citizens and contributing to the country as they grow.

Future Planning

Besides upholding the cultivation of “national identity”, the current plans and arrangements also promoted “healthy lifestyle” and “life planning” under the “seven learning goals” advocated by the Education Bureau. The school-based national education framework will be incorporated as routine to perpetuate the understanding on our country. Having gained knowledge in the country's development this academic year, the School will move on to provide students with the opportunities to serve using their own initiatives, allowing students to walk the talk of responsible citizenship next year.

In collaboration with new partners, the Service-Learning Department will renew its curriculum to allow students to go beyond our district- Tokwawan and meet needy people from all walks of life in Hong Kong. Students will then be asked to formulate concrete plans to assist their targets. As a good practice, the Personal Growth Programme will continue to offer students the chances to conduct voluntary teaching in the mainland. To deepen their experience and learning, students will also be asked to conduct sharing on their reflection after serving others. With the above, we hope that our students will embody true principles of “empathy” and “benevolence” with discernment, fortified with a strong commitment to serve at their corner of life.

3-Year Development Goal (3):

To equip students with the future-proof skills through strengthening Technology Education.

Annual Major Concern (3):

To promote STEM development through utilising the newly renovated Innovation Laboratory.

Progress and Achievements

The Technology Education curriculum was developed with the support of the newly renovated Innovation Laboratory. The newly procured 3D printing consumables, extension boards, display boards and tools allowed the Science and Technology curriculum to be extended. In Form Two, 3D

design and printing were introduced; while in Form One, new types of sensors were procured to facilitate their projects. The junior forms Computer Literacy curriculum was also revamped with the inclusion of more Artificial Intelligence (AI) technology such as CU-JC AI car in Forms One and Two while the Form Three syllabus had included more AI application

With the establishment of the Innovation Laboratory, a wider range of STEM-related activities were made possible on campus. For example, interest classes on Forensic Science Training Programme (Crime Scene Investigation) were arranged in June 2024. Engaging in the CUHK Jockey Club AI for the Future Project & Innovative laboratory project, a myriad of activities was arranged in the Innovation Laboratory. Pull-out programmes and training for the STEM teams across Forms Two to Five were also organised to promote STEM development. In 2023-24, the STEM teams participated in plentiful contests and programmes, including the AI x HK OPEN CUP 2023, the PolyU Engineering Project Competition 2023, the Hong Kong VPET Competition for Secondary Schools 2023/24, the Hong Kong Science Fair 2023-2024, the Girl-Powered Generative A.I. Fest, the 1st OSH Innovation & Technology Award, the Hong Kong Student Science Project Competition 2024, the Hong Kong ICT Awards 2024 (Student Innovation Award), the HKPC Summer TechEd Fest 2024 (Exhibition) and the CityU Database Minicontest 2023. Many teams returned with promising results. To highlight, the spacious Innovation Laboratory provided suitable venue for large scale robotics competition training. The in-house designed and 3D-printed artifacts greatly improved the efficiency and accuracy of the robots developed by the STEM (Robotics) Team. This was identified as the key factor leading to the Team's achievement- clinching the Grand Prize, in the 3rd Greater Bay Area AI & Tech Innovation Challenge, the best result among all participating girl's schools. Additionally, our Science Team was also acclaimed with Championship in the Hong Kong Student Science Competition. Their study primarily focused on how to utilise discarded avocado pits as a replacement for environmentally unfriendly oxygen absorbers available on the market, producing biodegradable packaging materials with the aid of equipment such as oxygen sensors and centrifuges, thereby promoting healthy lifestyle and sustainable development.

All the activities conducted in the Innovation Laboratory fulfilled the objectives and received unanimous positive feedbacks from participants. The activities helped unleash their creativity and allowed them to accomplish complicated tasks through collaboration. In the year-end survey, results revealed that over 80% of students agreed that the STEM development were promoted with the aid of the establishment of the Innovation Laboratory. Majority of them felt that their critical thinking and problem-solving skills were crafted. The training programmes utilising the resources of Innovation Laboratory had led students to broader categories of local and Greater Bay Area competitions and events when compared with previous years. These events allowed students to exercise and present their STEM knowledge as well as originality, organisation ability and collaborative skills, which were future-proof attributes underlined in the school's developmental focus.

Reflection

With the hardware enhancement, our girls had also made shown improvements in their soft skills. Although the procured tools may become obsolete, we were pleased that students were equipped with future-proof skills, including critical thinking, problem-solving, creativity, innovative thinking, active learning, adaptability, and effective teamwork. These skills had been fostered through the STEM-related curriculum and activities conducted in the Innovation Laboratory.

Recognising the importance of keeping pace with the latest scientific developments and technologies, our school provided comprehensive support for students participating in STEM-related competitions. Each year, the school's science teachers encourage students to form teams for these competitions and offer funding to acquire the necessary equipment and chemicals. Each participating team is assigned one to two science teachers for guidance, along with laboratory technicians who provide technical support. Furthermore, the school values the concepts of "sisterhood" and "mentorship" in promoting STEM development, encouraging experienced senior students to share their knowledge and guidance with new teams, thereby fostering mutual learning and exchange. This year, we were happy to see the scope and intensity of STEM exposure and experience for students had been expanded with the establishment of the Innovation Laboratory. While we have provided a more conducive environment for learning for students, and witnessing the increased demand for STEM related training, however, the number of STEM teachers remained stable. To further enhance STEM development, additional resources and opportunities should be allocated to enable them to elevate STEM initiatives to new heights. If additional manpower is not feasible, outsourcing the courses might be an option.

Future Planning

As a result of the aforementioned measures, the "information literacy" and "generic skills" of students, as outlined in the "seven learning goals" proposed by the Education Bureau, have been significantly enhanced. From prior experience, we observed that offering hands-on and maker experiences for students in learning STEM-related subjects is essential. Therefore, the school will organise a whole-school STEM-based Fun Fair in the upcoming academic year, allowing all students to integrate what they learn in STEM lessons into their class stalls. Building on previous successes, we will intensify our efforts to encourage students to participate in more STEM-related competitions and activities, along with providing additional opportunities for students to showcase their inventions and research achievements on campus. It is hoped that STEM education will not be confined to a select few but will be widely disseminated throughout the school.

CHAPTER 3: Student Performance

Students' Attitude and Behaviour

As a school founded on Christian values and a rich legacy, Heep Yunn is committed to fostering essential character strengths in our students, including integrity, humility, unity, gratitude, fortitude, temperance, commitment, and altruism. We hope to see our girls grown up to be humble yet assured; grateful and gracious; down-to-earth yet strong-willed; empathetic and inquiring- qualities that set Heep Yunn girls apart. To this end, we strive to create meaningful experiences for our students, supported by apposite counsel and guidance, to promote their holistic development. This commitment is aimed at unlocking their potential while helping them navigate the challenges that arise during their adolescence, a critical stage of their lives.

Learning in a community that encourages a growth mindset, our students make improvements and elevate their standards step by step. Our graduates are equipped with future-proof skills and virtues necessary to achieve their aspirations, overcome difficulties, and pursue their callings and missions with dedication and excellence, earning the trust of their peers and the wider community.

We believe that each student is graced with unique talents and gifts by our Heavenly Father. At the same time, we recognise shared traits among our students, shaped by their collective experiences in our school. Notably, they understand and appreciate the significance of teamwork and public service. The insights shared by our community members below are intended to provide a deeper understanding of student attitudes and behaviors within our educational environment.

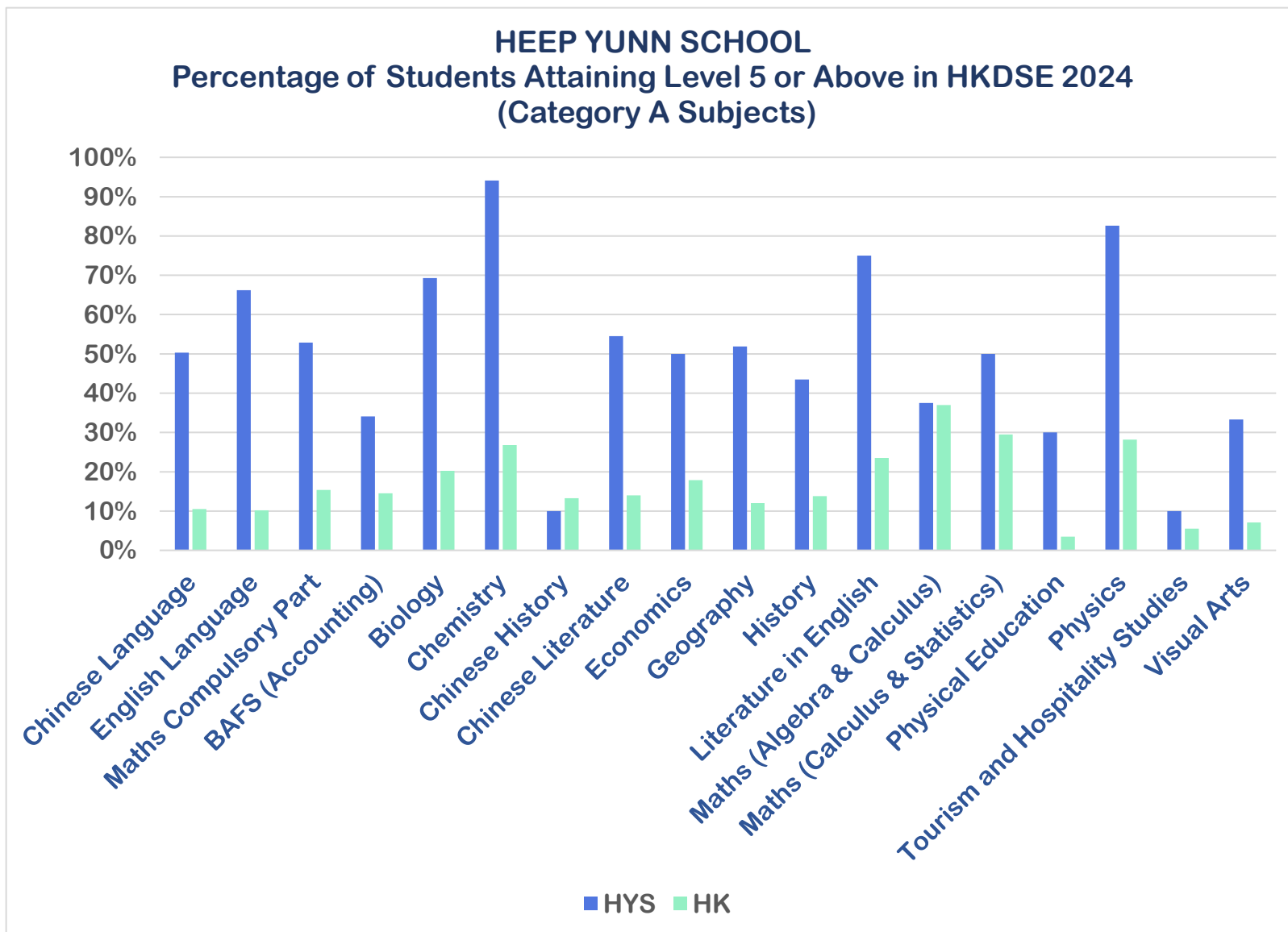

Students’ Academic Performance

Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination (2024)

Among the 154 Form Six students who took the 2024 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE) Examination, 33 of them had attained an impressive score exceeding 30 points in their best five subjects, including M1/ M2. On the whole, our students garnered 506 Level 5 or above, an average of 3.3 Level 5 or above for each of our girls. Results in all core subjects and electives of various key learning areas were heartening. Setting a new record, 11 out of the 19 category A subjects offered in our School made it to 50% or above of students achieving Level 5 and beyond, including Chemistry (94.1%), Physics (82.6%), Literature in English (75%), Biology (69.3%), English Language (66.2%), Chinese Literature (54.5%), Mathematics (52.9%), Geography (51.9%), Chinese Language (50.3%), Mathematics (Calculus & Statistics) (50%) and Economics (50%). All of our students attained the required standard in the new subject Citizenship and Social Development. About 90.3% of them have met the general entrance requirements for local bachelor degree programmes while 96.1% of them have attained the entrance requirements for local sub-degree programmes. About 92.7% of our Form Six graduates were offered a bachelor programme at local tertiary institutions and 102 students were offered a place by HKU, CUHK or HKUST through JUPAS, while 11 of them opted for venturing abroad at last.
