## Introduction





## Vision and Mission

It is the vision of the school to provide equal opportunities for quality and holistic Christian education for our students. The school's mission is to provide our students with a Christian education that nurtures their moral, intellectual, physical, social, aesthetic, and spiritual development; to instill in our girls a spirit of public service; and to build a firm foundation in both Chinese and English.



## School Background

Heep Yunn School is an Anglican (Sheng Kung Hui) school established in 1936 when two former C.M.S. (Church Missionary Society) institutions, namely Fairlea (1886) and Victoria Home & Orphanage (1887), were amalgamated. The name "Heep Yunn" means "United Grace", reflecting the school founders' vision to bring quality education to young women and orphans in answer to the call of duty at a time of economic instability and threat of war in 1930s Hong Kong. They believed in empowering students to bring enlightenment to our nation and serve our people. To this day, the school abides by their dedication to serving our fellow men in the love of Christ. In 2012, the school switched its status from a government grant-in-aid school to a direct subsidy scheme school, continuing in its mission to provide equal opportunities for quality and holistic Christian education.

With an increased number of teaching staff, we can offer more mentorship and career planning opportunities beyond the standard guidance and counselling services provided by subsidised schools.

We believe that every student should have the opportunity to succeed regardless of their financial situation. To achieve this, we offer a fee remission and scholarships scheme to students with financial needs. We are humbled by the opportunity to assist families in need and are committed to supporting all students in every way we can.

Heep Yunn School is a community founded on Christian beliefs. With our unwavering conviction and determined efforts, we strive to ensure that every child is given the opportunity to grow, thrive, and achieve their full potential in a supportive and nurturing environment. ## Heep Yunn Communities

### Heep Yunn School Parent Teacher Association (PTA)

### Heep Yunn Old Girls' Association (HYOGA)

### Heep Yunn Primary School (HYPS)

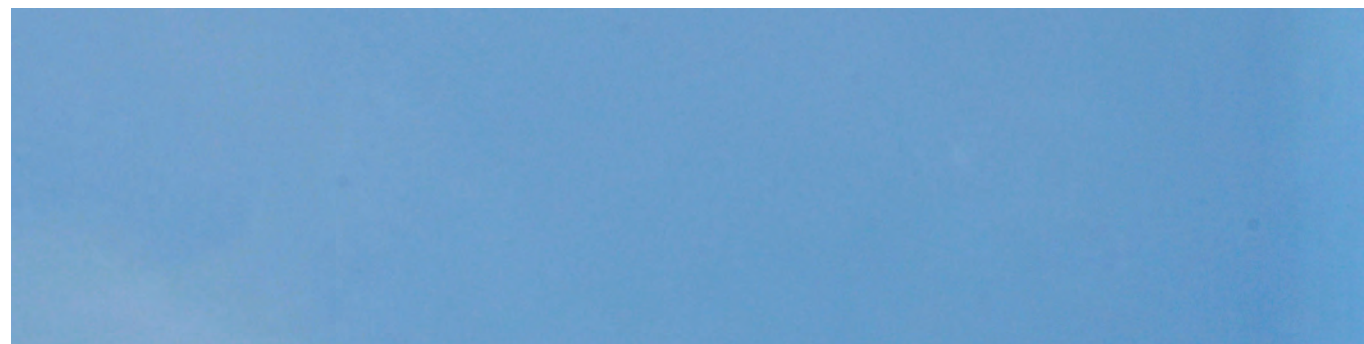
Founded in 1936, Heep Yunn Primary School is an aided primary school for girls. They offer classes from Primary One to Six, with three classes per primary level.

### Heep Yunn School Private Kindergarten (HYKG)

Established in 1936, Heep Yunn School Private Kindergarten is a non-profit making private kindergarten for girls. They offer classes from Kindergarten One to Three, with two classes per level. In 2017, HYSPK was granted a government subsidy, allowing them to offer free quality education to kindergarten students.







## Campus and Facilities

Our school is located on an 11,000 sq. m. campus consisting of six building blocks, each with its unique history and purposes. These include the Lau Cheung Suet Ming Building (1936), the Chapel of St. Clare of Assisi (1957), the Chau Hau Leung & Li Shiu Ching Building (1964), the Library (1966), the Jubilee Building (1986) and the Mr. & Mrs. Au Sue Hung Building (2005). Additionally, our outdoor facilities include a 25-metres swimming pool, 4 multi-purpose games courts, a rest garden, a parking area and a lawn. Indoors, we have the School Hall, Dining Room, Student Activity Centre, Student Development Centre, 30 special rooms including the Drama Laboratory, the Innovation Laboratory, and the Lecture Theatre, 30 classrooms, and a 3-storey high sports centre.

Small Group Teaching and Learning\*

Small group teaching is provided for the core subjects and skills-related subjects with about 25 students in each classroom to address learner diversity.

Medium of Instruction

English is the medium of instruction for all subjects except Chinese, Chinese Literature, Chinese History, Putonghua, Family and Life Education, and foreign language classes such as Japanese, Spanish, French, and Korean.

Learning Chinese Language in Putonghua

About one to two groups in each form learn Chinese in Putonghua from Form One to Form Three.

Other Languages Education  
(Japanese, French, Spanish and Korean as elective subjects)

Spanish is the third most-widely used language in the world, and French follows closely (at present, at least 10,000 terms in the English vocabulary originate from French). Students who are exposed to the cultures of other countries through languages can gain a much wider global view which gives them a competitive edge and more education and career opportunities. Interested students may take up one elective Foreign Language (French, Spanish, Japanese or Korean) at school starting from Form One and are encouraged to sit the respective public examinations from Form Four to Form Six.

# Academics

## Curriculum

At Heep Yunn School, we offer a diverse range of over 34 subjects for our students. These subjects are classified into eight categories in accordance with the key learning areas set by the Education Bureau. Our guiding principles for the regular curriculum are as follows:

- to provide students with an all-round education
- to promote lifelong education
- to cultivate globalism and respect for other cultures
- to adapt to the local environment and allow students to maintain a strong sense of national identity

### Senior Forms Curriculum\*

The Junior Secondary Curriculum is designed to provide a comprehensive education that covers all eight key learning areas of study. In the third year, the curriculum is specifically tailored to prepare students for the transition to the Senior Secondary Curriculum, equipping our students with the necessary skills and knowledge to succeed in their senior studies and beyond.

### Junior Forms Curriculum\*

The school provides a well-balanced spectrum of DSE elective subjects for students to choose from. In the recent selections for Form 4 electives conducted in the past few years, we offered over 50 combinations of main elective subjects out of the over 140 possible combinations, with over 70% of the students being offered their first three choices.

### School-based Curriculum

#### • Family and Life Education (Form One to Form Three)

Family and Life Education is a tailor-made subject designed to meet the developmental needs of Form One to Form Three students and instil positive values. In the first year, the course focuses mostly on helping students to adapt to our school's learning environment. It also covers essential life skills, study skills, and interpersonal relationship skills, drawing on real-life examples from their peers and school sisters to meet our students' specific needs.

#### • Science and Technology (Form One to Form Two)

The Science and Technology Education program is a curriculum for Forms One and Two that promotes design thinking, engineering, and experiential learning. During lessons, students are presented with real-world scenarios that require improvement. They are encouraged to brainstorm and generate their own ideas, and then bring their creations to life through collaborative practical work. They can apply their skills in extracurricular activities like the annual Fun Fair, STEM interest classes, and inter-school competitions.

We believe that everyone has the ability to design and bring about positive changes. Therefore, this curriculum is designed to foster a mindset that encourages students to tackle problems with vigour and make a positive impact on both their local communities and the world at large.

#### • Service Learning (Form Four)

We are dedicated to nurturing our students' compassion for others and preparing them to create positive impacts to the community in the future. To this end, we have implemented a School-based Service Learning Curriculum for all Form Four students starting from the 2022-23 academic year.

Collaborating with non-government organisations and tertiary institutions, the curriculum fosters empathy towards disadvantaged groups in society and equips students with design thinking and entrepreneurship skills. Through authentic contexts, students identify the needs and challenges of users and apply interdisciplinary knowledge to devise and test solutions to real-world problems. Our goal is to develop students' interests and readiness for future engagement in social innovation projects.





# Academics

## Assessment Policy

Both summative and formative assessments are adopted to evaluate students' learning progress. Apart from biannual examinations and form tests, students are regularly assessed through their assignments and projects.

Junior Form students have the option to apply to take the Cambridge First Certificate in English (FCE) and International General Certificate of Secondary Education – English (IGCSE – Eng) whereas Senior Form students have the option to apply to take the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), the London Chamber of Commerce and Industry (LCCI) and the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) examinations. Preparation classes are provided for students, and the number of examinations a student may take is subject to the school's approval.

Heep Yunn School offers students ample opportunities to develop their own interests and realise their potential outside the formal school curriculum. The guiding principles for providing co-curricular activities are to:

Equipped with reasoned discourse and discernment, our students are trained to be visionary leaders serving and connecting our community with compassion, conviction, and courage.

## Leadership

### School Prefects

The Prefects Team comprises the Head Prefect, the Second Head Prefect, and a group of Form Four to Form Six prefects, led by six team leaders. Every year, members of both the teaching staff and student body participate in elections to choose the Head Prefects, ensuring that the Prefects Team represents the voice of the students and serves as a vital bridge between the students and the school. Being the largest student organisation at school, the Prefects Team has several objectives: maintaining discipline, cultivating self-discipline and responsibility among their fellow school-mates, and leading by example in various school events.

Additionally, Form Three students are provided with a remarkable opportunity to contribute to the team as junior prefects. They undergo interviews and training before formally joining the team.



### Student Association

The Student Association (SA) is led by an Executive Committee, assisted by members of the subsidiary committee. The Executive Committee serves as a liaison between the school and the student body including the five houses and approximately twenty clubs and societies.

Divided into eight departments, the SA is responsible for organising a wide range of co-curricular activities, major school functions and welfare services. Activities such as the Form One Orientation Programme and Camp, Inter-house Singing Contest, Inter-house Sports Competitions, Foundation Day, as well as various forums and seminars are organised annually, which often create cherished collective memories and foster unity and a lifelong bond among our students.



### Student Council

As a part of the Secretaries Department within the Student Association (SA), the Student Council serves as the official advisory body of the school. Comprised of representatives from each class, its primary objective is to gather and articulate student opinions effectively. Class representatives have the privilege of submitting proposals and raising motions during the formal meetings held annually, where these ideas are discussed, deliberated upon, and voted upon. Subsequently, relevant reports are compiled and presented to the Headmistress for consideration. An annual dialogue between the Headmistress and all students is organised at the end of each school year, which provides an opportunity for open and direct interaction, encouraging effective communication between the students and the school.





## Co-curricular Activities

### Music

Music is an integral part of the vibrant atmosphere at Heep Yunn School. Our Music Department offers a diverse range of musical groups and instrumental classes, providing students with opportunities to further their music education beyond the confines of the classroom. In addition to the four choirs, five orchestral groups, and various instrumental classes, our school takes an active role in organising and participating in a variety of music camps, master classes, outbound inter-flows, and competitions. We take great pride in creating memorable occasions for our students to showcase their musical talents, ranging from performing at major school functions, Christmas carolling at prestigious hotels, and participating in the annual school concert 'Heartstring'. Lunchtime ensemble performances and visits to other schools further enrich their musical experiences, fostering a strong foundation in music. Our groups actively take part in both local and overseas choir and instrumental competitions, such as the renowned World Choir Games, and have received many awards over the years. In local competitions such as the Hong Kong Schools' Music Festivals, we have consistently bagged the top three places in the different categories.

## Sports

Covering a wide range of sports activities, Heep Yunn houses twenty-one sports teams, which have achieved a very high standard of performance. Since 1984, we have proved to be dominant in girls' sports in the Hong Kong and Kowloon regions and have consistently held the title of the Overall Champion of the much-coveted BOC(HK) Bauhinia Bowl Award (formerly the Omega Rose Bowl).

Our school takes great pride in the active participation of our students in sports teams in the Division I Level, as recognised by the Hong Kong School Sports Federation. Remarkably, at least one in three of our students are involved in the teams, showcasing their enthusiasm for sports. To foster a strong sense of unity and collaboration among our athletes, teams practice two to three times a week on campus whenever possible.

Through our 'One Sports One Life' programme, we ensure that every student can participate in at least one sports interest class from the moment they join our school. This shared experience not only cultivates essential qualities like fortitude but also instils values of sportsmanship and a never-give-up mentality in our students.

## Student Support





# Counselling

All teachers have a mission to provide pastoral care to our students. Students are encouraged to approach any teacher when they are in need, particularly their class teachers, mentors, and teachers-in-charge of co-curricular activities. These teachers have frequent interactions with students and offer timely assistance to students. In addition to teachers, senior form students or “big sisters” are also there to support new students in adapting to the new learning environment.

## Guidance Programmes

### The Big Sisters Scheme

Our school organises the Big Sisters Scheme every year to help Form One students adapt to the new learning environment. Form One students are paired with “big sisters” from Forms Three and Four. Activities include an adventure-based training camp, community services, and tea gatherings. Application is open at the beginning of the first term each year.

### Form One Induction Programme

Each year, we organise the Form One Induction Programme before the commencement of the new school year. The school seeks the expertise of an educational psychologist to assist in preparing new students for the challenges they may encounter and to equip them with the necessary skills for a smooth adjustment to this new phase of education.

### Peer Support Network

Peer Support Network enables students to build better social relationships through participating in activities organised by the school social workers with an aim to boost students’ self-confidence and help them develop better social skills.



## Support Services for Parents

### Parents’ Days/ Nights

Effective communication between the school and parents is essential. Thus, periodic Parents’ Days/Nights are held. Apart from meeting Form Teachers to understand more about the performance of their children, parents can attend talks conducted by professionals to equip them with more effective parenting skills.

### Emotional Coaching Workshop

To equip parents with skills to support their children’s developmental adjustment, the school’s educational psychologist organises workshops on how to be effective emotional coaches. These workshops provide valuable guidance for parents in helping their children manage emotional challenges. Parents are encouraged to participate in these workshops to enhance their ability to assist their children with their emotional well-being.

### Service for Students with Special Needs

To support students with special needs, the school provides professional assistance from the educational psychologist and clinical psychologist, in addition to the services offered by school social workers. These professionals offer individual care for students and collaborate with parents to address their specific needs. The school also organises various skills training programmes, including workshops on emotional management and executive functioning, to further support these students in their development.







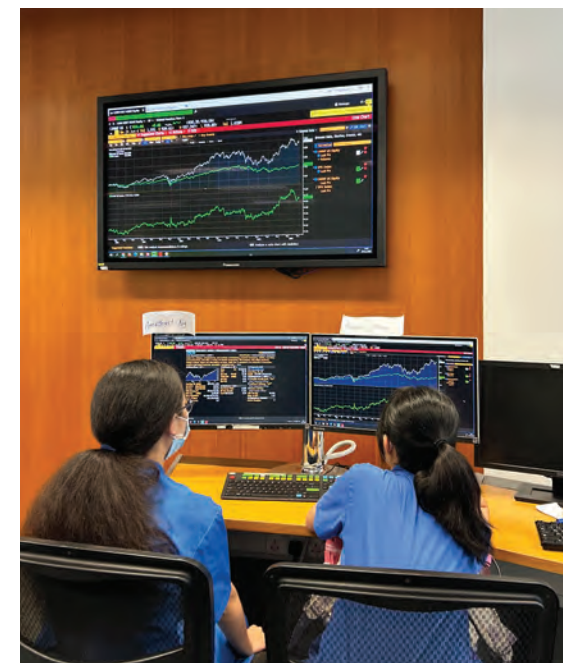
## Careers and Guidance

Heep Yunn is committed to developing our Careers and Guidance provision to meet the diverse needs, abilities, orientations, and interests of our students. Our goal is to improve awareness, skill sets, and connections with extended stakeholders and to guide students in making informed choices at key transition points in their careers and life planning.

To inculcate students with the proper notions of professionalism, our school pioneered a 4-day work experience placement programme, liaising over 60 places of work to provide on-the-site work experience for the entire Form Four. We make every effort to ensure that students are given relevant, useful and practical advice and experience to maximise their choices while minimising their worries and struggles in their key life stages.

## Equal Opportunities for Quality Christian Education

As part of our commitment to providing equal opportunities for quality education, 30% of the total school fee income is allocated to the scholarships and fee remission scheme.

### Scholarships\*

Students who demonstrate exceptional talent or have achieved excellent accomplishments are eligible to receive scholarships through our programme. Various types of scholarships are awarded, including full scholarships, half scholarships, quarter scholarships, and fixed monetary amount scholarships.

### Fee Remission Scheme\*

We believe in serving students from diverse socio-economic backgrounds and fulfilling our social responsibility by promoting upward social mobility. We place great importance on providing opportunities for students from financially disadvantaged families. To ensure inclusivity, we have implemented a supportive fee remission system. This commitment enables us to maintain an open and accessible education environment for all students, regardless of their financial circumstances.

The school provides a fee remission scheme for needy students, including those from families receiving Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) and students receiving financial assistance from the Student Financial Office (SFO). Fee remission is offered to eligible students, subject to the availability of funds in the scheme.

Needy students can apply for fee remission through their parents or legal guardians. The level of fee remission granted depends on the family's gross annual income, with varying levels available and a maximum of full fee cut (100%).

### Living Expenses Subsidy

Students eligible for full (100%), three-quarters (75%), or half (50%) fee remission can apply for living expenses subsidies in times of financial difficulties. These subsidies can be granted for up to 10 months within an academic year, depending on the suitability of each case. Students who are eligible for fee remission will receive information about the living expenses subsidies upon the successful application for the respective fee remission level.
